

2. Did your club plan any recruitment activities surrounding this project? If so, please describe. Did you recruit any new members?

We did not require to recruit any new members for these projects. The teaching staff at the Home helped out by making sure that the patients went to all the Doctors one by one. However in the month of March 2007 we have recruited 4 new members into the club.

3. Did your club plan any public relations/community education/or media activities surrounding this project? If so, please describe.

These particular projects were meant for the community in the neighbourhood of the Quota Home as well as the slums where the children come from. So in the two weeks ahead of the scheduled date, fliers were sent to every household in the area. The information was also given on the TV and by announcements in the slum areas where people are not literate enough to read the fliers. The Doctor at the home alongwith one of the staff, also paid a visit to the families of the children attending the school and informed them of the camps.

These projects were some of the community projects of Quota International planned for the year. Members actually participated in the above projects by helping in the registration of the patients and in making sure that the entire process went smoothly.
